

While in the Residential Re-entry Center (RRC), you will be required to follow all rules of the facility. Failure to comply can lead to discharge from the facility and violation of supervised release action. Below is a list of some of the RRC rules and requirements. Upon your arrival at the RRC you will receive the handbook and additional rules provided by RRC staff.

1. You will remain on lock down for the first 48 hours while you are processed.
2. You will be permitted to leave the facility for employment and counseling purposes only. There will be no weekend passes home to visit family (There are visiting hours for your family to visit you on the weekend at the RRC)
3. All departures from the facility must be approved by the probation officer, in accordance with RRC rules and regulations. You must, therefore, submit all requests for passes at least 1 week in advance. You will not be approved for leave if you fail to submit your requests timely.
4. You must secure and maintain verifiable, on-the-books employment.
5. You must remit the required subsistence payment, 25% of your gross salary, as directed by the facility staff.
6. You must submit to substance abuse testing, as directed by the facility staff. There is a zero tolerance policy for any drug use unless prescribed by a physician. You will be subject to breathalyzer and pat search upon entry into the facility.
7. Food products containing poppy seeds are prohibited.
8. Products containing alcohol, including mouthwash and cologne, are prohibited.
9. Vicks, Benzedrex and other inhalers are prohibited.
10. Cell phones are prohibited, inside and outside of the facility, and will be confiscated by RRC staff if found on your person or among your possessions, and will lead to discharge from the facility.
11. iPods, iPads, related devices, and televisions larger than 13" are prohibited.
12. Residents must follow the rules and regulations while at the RRC, and failure to do so will result in an incident report, which will be written and issued to the resident, and your Probation Officer will be notified for appropriate action.
